Induction to the Glengarry Celtic Music Hall of Fame

The Glengarry Celtic Hall of Fame, famous for its celebration of local Celtic Music in Glengarry, recently inducted Robert Kitts, a piper of The Glengarry Pipe Band. Robert Kitts is my Dad.

Robert, also known as Bob was born in Maxville, Ontario



My Dad has played an active role in the Celtic community of S.D & G for over 60 years. Beginning at the age of 15, Dad grew a fondness for playing the bagpipes. As a Celtic dancer, he enjoyed the music and began practicing the instrument. Later in the 1960s, he joined The Glengarry Pipe Band competing in competitions and traveling to perform at local charitable events across Canada and the United States.

Later in the 1980s, despite his passion for bagpipes, Kitts opened the Kodak Printing Shop on Pitt Street in Cornwall, Ontario. During this time, Kitts continued to play for the Glengarry Pipe Band including performances at local establishments such as the Royal Canadian Legion and various events such as Remembrance Day and the Santa Claus Parade.



Music produced by the Glengarry Pipe Band during this time, specifically between 1972 to 1988 was presented on an album titled “Gracing the Stage, Glengarry”, which includes music by Robert Kitts with The Glengarry Pipe Band, live recording from the National Art Centre. All artists showcased on this album have been inducted into The Glengarry Celtic Music Hall of Fame.

The Netherlands – Matt

My Grandfather was born in Holland, which is why I’ve chosen this topic for my article. After the Second World War his family emigrated to Canada. I think my grandpa was 10 when they emigrated.



I’d like to tell you about Holland, also known as the Netherlands. The Netherlands is a small country located between Belgium and Germany. The Netherlands has a population of 17.44 million people. The main Language is Dutch, although most people speak English. The Dutch also have their own sign language called Nederandse. In the North of Holland, they speak Frisian. Netherlands has two capital cities. Amsterdam is officially the Capital city, but since the Dutch Government has been in the Hague for hundreds of years, so The Hague also serves at the functional Capital

Since 1914, The Netherland has a Constitutional Monarchy. During the Second World war, the Dutch Monarchy took refuge in Ottawa. The Queen gave birth to Princess Margriet at the Ottawa Civic Hospital in 1943. After the war, the citizens of Holland began sending tulip bulbs to Ottawa as a thank you. The gift of these tulips is what has created the Tulip Festival in Ottawa. Tulip Bulbs continue to arrive yearly. Since 2013 Willem-Alexander has been the reigning Monarch.



I have chosen three Dutch Cities to talk about, they are Delft, Gouda, The Hague. Delft is located in the Province of South Holland between the cities of The Hague and Rotterdam.

Delft is famous for Delftware pottery that was produced, it was white and blue.



Gouda is located in the West Netherlands between Rotterdam and Utrecht, it has a population 74,134. It is known for its Gouda cheese, Stroopwafels, smoking pipes and 15th century city halls.

The Hague is the third largest city with a population of over 500 000.

The Hague is situated on the coastal plain with city centre just inland from the North Sea. The Hague (Den Haag) name began in the early 13th century, when Count Floris

IV purchased land on the western coast of Holland and then built a luxurious hunting lodge on the banks of a nearby lake called de Hofvijve.

The Hague is the third largest city in the Netherlands after Amsterdam and Rotterdam.

Five Facts About the Hague

(1) The Prime Minister teaches at a local school

Talk about cool! I doubt this would happen in many other countries, but in the Netherlands, with the majority being so down-to-earth, having your prime minister teach you is totally possible. Mark Rutte, the Prime Minister, is a guest teacher at Johan de Witt Scholengroep (School Group) in The Hague. He teaches pupils Dutch and citizenship and has been doing so since September 2008.

(2) The symbol for The Hague is a stork

If you take a look at the coat of arms from The Hague, you'll find a stork on a shield, stood on one leg, eating an eel. The shield is held by two golden lions. That's all well and good, but why a stork?

Well, back in the 14th century, the Binnenhof was a complex of farms, and storks happened to build their nests there and these were then maintained. People thought that storks brought luck.



Storks were not only thought to be lucky, but they were also actually useful too, as they cleaned up the mess at the fish market square. It was in 1541 that storks were first seen on The Hague coat of arms. In 2006, there was talk of removing the stork from the city logo, but after large protests, the municipality decided against it.

(3) The Hague is home to the longest lane

Yes, that's right, the longest lane in the Netherlands can be found in The Hague. So, if you're thinking about how long that street you're walking on seems, just remember, there is one that is so much longer.

The Laan van Meerdervoort, is a great 5.8 kilometres long. But don't get the lane confused and start thinking it is the longest street, because it most definitely isn't. The longest street belongs to Oudebildtdijk in Friesland at around 12.1 kilometres.

(4) The first tennis courts in the Netherlands were in The Hague

It's hard to think of people playing tennis in the 1500s, but that they did, and where else than in The Hague, at the Binnenhof to be precise. The only thing that is left of these courts is a commemorative stone with the inscription "*Op deze plek bevond zich tussen circa 1500 en 1650 's lands eerste tennisbaan 'de Caetsbaan' van de Prinsen van Oranje*".

The inscription roughly translates as "At this spot between around 1500 and 1650 there was the country's first tennis court "de Caetsbaan" of the Princes of Orange". Of course, tennis back then is not the same tennis we know today. Back then, the predecessor of tennis was played in Western Europe between 1500 and 1800. Today's tennis came into existence in 1874.

(5) It has a flame that never dies

How it stays alight I do not know, but it does. The Hague has a flame in the Peace Palace, the Eternal Peace Flame as it is called, which never dies. This flame burns beside the entrance to the Palace and was placed there in 2002. The monument housing the flame has a particularly moving inscription: "May all beings find peace". In 2004, the flame was surrounded by the World Peace Path, which consists of 196 stones, big and small, from 196 countries. Some stones are particularly special, such as a piece of the Berlin Wall and a stone from the island where Nelson Mandela was imprisoned.

Pannenkoeken; is a style of pancake with origins in the Netherlands. Pannenkoeken are usually larger (up to a foot in diameter) and much thinner than their American or Scottish pancake counterparts, but not as thin as crêpes. They may incorporate slices of bacon, apples, cheese, or raisins. Plain ones are often eaten with treacle (syrup

made of sugar beets), *appelstroop* (an unspiced Dutch variety of apple butter) or (powdered) sugar and are sometimes rolled up to be eaten by hand or with cutlery.

Queen Elizabeth II celebrate 70th year as Monarch

The Queen's Platinum Jubilee – Shelby and Friends

On the 6th of February the Queen will become the first British monarch to celebrate a Platinum Jubilee, marking a 70-year reign. A series of celebrations will take place throughout the year.

The celebration started on January 10th and will continue throughout 2022.

Queen Elizabeth II became second in line to the throne (after her father) when her Uncle King Edward VIII gave up the throne so he could marry the twice divorced Wallis Simpson.

Elizabeth's accession grew great criticism as the people did not believe a woman could run the monarchy properly. Yet, Elizabeth proved these individuals wrong by handling her royal duties in a responsible and professional manner.

Although events will happen all year, it will round off with a four-day UK bank holiday weekend from June 2-5.

The first event begins with a competition to invent a new pudding (dessert) to celebrate the Queen's reign.

And during the Platinum Jubilee Pageant, a River Of Hope - made up of 200 silk flags decorated with images of hope drawn by children - will make its way along the Mall in central London.

As part of the Queen's Green Canopy initiative, some 60,000 trees have already been planted to mark the year, as people have been encouraged to "plant a tree for the Jubilee".


As many of you know, I had spinal stenosis surgery (C5-6) and now have mobility issues.

## Kinsmen Bingo Cards




The Kinsmen Club have given us the opportunity to assemble TV bingo cards. We started on a trial basis, we at Beyond 21 completed many tasks to do this

Have you ever met a Senator? Do you know how to become a Senator or what it is they do? We got the answers to all these questions when my friend Senator Bernadette Clement visited us through Zoom on March 24<sup>th</sup>. She reminded us that the very first place she visited when she became Mayor was Beyond 21. We were able to ask all kinds of questions during our Zoom.

### Participant Question

“What does a Senator do?”

The Senate reviews proposed bills before they are passed. The Senate has become an important group for representing minority interests and groups who are not well

represented in the elected chamber (such as Indigenous peoples, minority language and ethnic groups, and women). The Senate's committees investigate studies on important social and political issues facing the country, such as poverty, aging, unemployment, land use, and national defense.

### Participant Question

“How does someone become a Senator?”

Canadians must complete an application to become a Senator. There are usually 105 Senators in the Senate of Canada, the upper chamber of Canada's Parliament. Canadian Senators are appointed by the Governor General of Canada on the advice of the Canadian Prime Minister. Canadian Senators must be at least 30 years old and retire at the age of 75. Senators also must own property and reside in the Canadian province or territory which they represent.

### Participant Question

How are Senators chosen

Under the Canadian Constitution, the Governor General appoints individuals to the Senate. Senators are appointed on the advice of the Prime Minister. Candidate applications are reviewed by the Independent Advisory Board for Senate

Appointments, which provides recommendations to the Prime Minister.

### Participant Question

How did you find out you'd been selected and what was your reaction?

I received a phone call from Prime Minister Trudeau telling me that I had been selected. My reaction was very mixed. I was very quiet and then the Prime Minister spoke.

Prime Minister: “Bernadette, are you still there?”
